I received a special personal award during this period when awarded "2010 Photographer of the Year" from the Arkansas College Media Association.

Under the head university photographer, I gained much of my early photography experience photographing a spectacular variety of sporting events, concerts, public relations campaigns, spot news, alumni magazine articles, and university programs. My wife and I have sailed from Ipswich, England, to Savannah, Georgia, a total distance of more than 10,000 miles. For every mile of it, I have been in charge of everything from provisioning to navigation to sail handling to dealing with customs and immigration and ensuring the safety of the ship and the crew. We have sailed in all manner of conditions ranging from Atlantic winter storms to the calm seas of the Caribbean. Aboard PROTEUS, I have sailed to seventeen countries and crossed the Atlantic Ocean.
